

Residential Parking Permit Program

The Residential Parking Permit Program has been established to preserve neighborhood living near popular beach locations within the City limits of South Lake Tahoe.



It is designed to provide parking spaces for residents and their guests by discouraging parking by people who do not live in the area.

Enforcement of the Residential Permit Parking will begin on June 28, 2013.

A resident of a Residential Parking Permit area who needs street parking must apply for a FREE permit and display it on their vehicle. Parking Permits are issued to a license plate number and may only be used with that plate.

Residential Parking Permit Frequently Asked Questions:

If you need street parking for your personal vehicle, then you need a residential parking permit.

How will Residential Parking Permits benefit me?

- A Residential Parking Permit is provided to residents to ensure more parking spaces are available for residents by restricting long term parking for non-residents.
- Neighborhoods can experience an influx of non-resident vehicles during special events, weddings, high tourist seasons, etc.
- Residents do not have to pay for Residential Parking Permits or for “guest” parking permits for their invited guests.

How do I get a Residential Parking Permit?

You are eligible for a Residential Parking Permit for your vehicle if you live in an established Residential Permit Parking area, which would be indicated by this sign. (shown below)



How long is my Residential Parking Permit valid?

Two years at no cost to the homeowner.

Where can I park with a Residential Parking Permit?

Residential Parking Permit areas are designated by signs indicating “Permit Parking Only.” Your Residential Parking Permit is valid for the color/letter of your neighborhood.

What if I have guests at my house?

Guest permits may be requested by residents within a Residential Parking Permit area for guests/visitors, to keep on hand.
