

Parks & Recreation Commission Meeting

+ American Red Cross Lifeguard Certification



The South Lake Tahoe Recreation Department is offering American Red Cross Certified Lifeguard Training. The class is conducted by American Red Cross Certified Instructor Liz Terzian and will provide participants with the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize, and respond to aquatic emergencies. Participants will be trained and certified to provide care for breathing and cardiac emergencies, injuries, and sudden illness until EMS (emergency services) take over.

Five classes will be held March 14th - 22nd on Mondays, Tuesdays & Thursdays, 4:00pm—8:30pm. Participants can register by March 14th at www.cslt.sportssignup.com.

South Tahoe Action Team Graduates

The fifth session of the South Lake Tahoe Fire Department's South Tahoe Action Team (STAT) graduated on March 1, 2016.

This program is for community members to be trained by the South Lake Tahoe Fire Department as responders during times of crisis. Curriculum includes eight (8) hours of instruction taught by members of the South Lake Tahoe Fire Department. Graduates may be called upon in times of natural disaster, large scale emergencies and times of need in the South Lake Tahoe area. The curriculum also instructs STAT team members of the Incident Command structure, emergency first aid, lifting/moving techniques, use of extinguishers, flood safety and building collapse.

Emergency Preparedness—Month 3 PREPARING TO RECOVER

After a major disaster, you may need financial assistance and will want to document any property loss for insurance and income tax purposes. Having ready access to the documents necessary for completing application forms, as well as those which could be difficult to replace, will help reduce delay and frustration.



AT A MINIMUM:

- 1) Gather property insurance papers (home, auto, boat, etc.) and make copies.
- 2) Gather health insurance papers (medical provider, dental provider, life, extended disability, etc.) and make copies.
- 3) Gather financial papers (bank, investment, retirement, etc.) and make copies.
- 4) Gather wills, powers of attorney, and estate papers and make copies.
- 5) Take photos or videos of all valuables as documentation for insurance claims.

** Store these copies and photos in a safe deposit box, or in a ziplock bag in your freezer.*


Commemorative Book Honors City's First 50 Years
